

INCREASING MONITORING ACTIVITIES FOR DMRADP IMPLEMENTATION



(*Davao City, 2 May 2017*). The Regional Development Council (RDC) XI approved the Davao Region Development Plan (DRDP), 2017-2022 on December 13, 2016 through RDC XI Resolution No. 79, s. 2016. The DRDP mirrors the Philippine Development Plan, 2017-2022 which lays the foundation for the long-term vision, the “AmBisyon Natin 2040”.

Through the Davao Region Development Plan (DRDP), 2017-2022, the Diwalwal Mineral Reservation Area (DMRA) is given renewed support by increasing the monitoring activities for the implementation of the DMRA Development Plan’s plan of action to address the management issues in the area.

Incorporated in the DRDP, 2017-2022, are priority governance strategies and activities to improve and enhance the social well-being of the communities within the DMRA, viz:

1. Information shall be publicly accessible through websites and publications of financial reports by LGU, NGAs, and other key players in DMRA;
2. Strengthen delivery of entitlements such as education, health, justice, shelter, livelihood, infrastructures; and
3. Conduct of vulnerability assessment in geohazard prone areas and of high mineral potential areas within Mineral Reservation Areas.

In the monitoring and evaluation of the DMRADP, the Results-based Monitoring and Evaluation Framework or RbME is used to give focus on the measurement of results that relevant stakeholders expect to achieve in its implementation. Assessing outcomes based on agreed time-frame is emphasized under the RbME. The identification of players or stakeholders of the DMRA including their roles are defined in the stakeholder’s analysis.

The evaluation mechanism shall involve an assessment of planned, ongoing, or completed intervention to determine the relevance, efficiency, effectiveness, impact and sustainability of interventions. The intent is to incorporate lessons learned in to the decision-making process.

To ensure the implementation of the RbME, the National Task Force Diwalwal-Program Monitoring and Coordination Center (NTFD-PMCC), headed by the DENR XI shall establish a database to track the performance of programs, activities and projects (PAPs) and the extent of achievement of results. The NTFD-PMCC shall maintain the database and takes charge of informing the PMCC Member Agencies on

problems and issues needing intervention in the course of project implementation. The PMCC shall also collaborate with other monitoring bodies in the Region, such as, the Regional Project Monitoring Council (RPMC) XI to assist in monitoring the programs, activities and projects particularly those that have regional or national significance.

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
